Species Requiring Rare Bird Reports to be Submitted to Regional Editor

Species

The following normally seen species were not found during count day this year: Redhead, Am. Kestrel, Bonaparte's Gull, Herring Gull, Ringbill Gull. Again this year there are many Snowy Owl sighting reports from nearby areas.

Individual Red-headed Woodpeckers are typically found in our count area, but this year we found 5 in a tiny car-sized area, all behaving in the same manner: leaving a low branch to land on exposed dirt a snow plow had uncovered on the shoulder of a rural road.
