Warblers: Palm, Chestnut-sided, Black-Throated Green, Yellow-Rump, Orange Crowned; Sparrows: White-throated, White Crowned, Fox; Kinglets, Winter Wren, Darkeyed Junco, Snow Goose, Red-Winged Blackbird, Eastern Bluebird, Swans, Brown Creeper, Red-Breasted Nuthatch (more than usual), Black-Capped Chickadee, Blue Jays, Tufted Titmouse, Mourning Doves, Rock Pigeons, Common Grackles, usual woodpeckers.
